HEARING DECISION

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37 upon the Claimant's request for a hearing. After due notice, a telephone hearing was conducted from Detroit, Michigan on Thursday, August 15, 2013. Claimant appeared and testified. Participating on behalf of the Department of Human Services ("Department") was ██████████

ISSUE

Whether the Department properly calculated Claimant's Food Assistance Program ("FAP") benefits.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for FAP benefits on July 1, 2013.
2. On June 7, 2013, Claimant received \$580.13 in gross earnings and \$527.00 in gross earnings on June 21, 2013. (Exhibit 2)
3. Claimant's group size is 1.
4. Claimant does not have a mortgage or a rent obligation.

5. As a result of the income, the Department determined Claimant's FAP allotment was \$16.00. (Exhibit 1)
6. On July 5, 2013, the Department sent a Notice of Case Action to Claimant, informing her that she was approved for FAP benefits in the amount of \$16.00/month. (Exhibit 3)
7. On July 18, 2013, the Department received Claimant's timely written request for hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual ("BAM"), the Bridges Eligibility Manual ("BEM"), and the Reference Tables ("RFT").

The Food Assistance Program ("FAP"), formerly known as the Food Stamp program, is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"). The Department, formerly known as the Family Independence Agency, administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and Mich Admin Code, Rules 400.3001 through R 400.3015.

All countable earned and unearned income available to the client must be considered in determining the Claimant's eligibility for program benefits. BEM 500 (January 2013), pp. 1, 2. All income is converted to a monthly amount. BEM 505 (October 2010), p. 1. A standard monthly amount must be determined for each income source used in the budget. BEM 505, p. 1. Weekly benefit amounts are converted to a monthly amount by multiplying the weekly amount by 4.3. BEM 505, p. 6. Bi-weekly amounts are converted by multiplying the amount by 2.15. BEM 505, p. 6.

In this case, Claimant applied for FAP benefits on July 1, 2013. For the month of June 2013, Claimant received two pay checks; one in the amount of \$580.13, and the other in the amount of \$527.00. Pursuant to policy, the Department was required to convert Claimant's income from employment to a standard monthly amount. The Department added the two amounts together ($\$580.13 + 527.00 = \$1,107.03$) and then divided by two to get the bi-weekly average of \$553.50 ($\$1,107.03 \div 2 = \553.50). In converting the bi-weekly amount to a monthly figure, the Department was required to multiply the bi-weekly average by 2.15 to arrive at a standard monthly income figure of \$1,190.00. ($\$553.50 \times 2.15 = \$1,190.03$).


In reviewing the Department's FAP budget, the Department correctly determined Claimant's standard monthly income; used the correct group size, and did not include any housing expenses which resulted in a monthly FAP benefits amount of \$16.00. Ultimately, the Department established it acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Claimant's FAP allotment. Accordingly, the Department's determination is AFFIRMED.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, finds the Department established it acted in accordance with department policy when it determined Claimant's FAP eligibility.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED:

The Department's FAP determination is AFFIRMED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
