The program is implemented by Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 98 and 99. The Depart ment provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and 1999 AC, Rule 400.5001 through Rule 400.5015.
Additionally, the Department 's Bridges Eligib ility Manual (BEM) 210, "FIP Group Composition," states that t he FIP program is a program des igned to assist children to live in su pportive family settings. Departm ent of Human Services Bridg es Eligibility Manual (BEM) 210 (2013), p. 1. In the case under consideration, t here is no dispute that there is no child in the home.
When there is no chaild in the home, BEM states that there is no eligibality for FIP benefits. <i>Id.</i> A ccordingly, the D epartment acted in accordance with policy and procedure when it denied Claimant FIP benefits.
Based upon the abov e Findings of Fact and Co nclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, the Administrative Law Judge concludes that the Department

<u>NOTICE OF APPEAL</u>: Michigan Ad ministrative Hea ring Syst em (MAHS) may orde r a rehea ring or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the fin al decision cannot be im plemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 3 0 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existe d at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to a ddress in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
