

HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on October 23, 2013, from Lansing, Michigan. Claimant participated in the hearing by telephone initially. Before the evidence was reviewed Claimant: became agitated; asserted that it did not make any difference because we (government) do whatever we want to; and hung up. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ES

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's July 2, 2013 Food Assistance Program (FAP) application for failure to provide required verifications?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On July 2, 2013 Claimant applied for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
- On August 12, 2013 Claimant was sent a Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) requesting verification of information necessary to determine eligibility. The required verifications were due on August 22, 2013.

- 3. On August 16, 2013, the Department received documentation from Claimant. Review of the documentation showed that the mortgage statement was from 2008 and there was no verification of Claimant's property taxes.
- 4. On August 22, 2013, Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated her application was denied for failure to verify required information.
- 5. On September 4, 2013, Claimant filed a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 271.1 to 285.5. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

The Verification Checklist (DHS Form 3503) which was sent to Claimant on August 12, 2013 specifically requested current property tax records and a current mortgage company or lender statement. Claimant did not provide these required verifications.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Claimant's July 2, 2013 Food Assistance Program (FAP) application.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the
 outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights
 of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
