HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Phyliss Frierson, ES.

ISSUE

Due to excess income, did the Department properly deny the Claimant's application \boxtimes close Claimant's case \square reduce Claimant's benefits for:

- Family Independence Program (FIP)? Food Assistance Program (FAP)?
 - Adult Medical Assistance (AMP)?
 - State Disability Assistance (SDA)?

Medical Assistance (MA)?

Child Development and Care (CDC)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant \square applied for \square received: **FIP** \square FAP \square MA \square AMP benefits.
- 2. On September 25, 2013, the Department denied Claimant's application \boxtimes closed Claimant's case \square reduced Claimant's benefits due to excess income.

- 3. On September 25, 2013, the Department sent Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR) its decision.
- 4. On September 30, 2013, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

☐ The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and 400.57a and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101 to .3131.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 271.1 to 285.5. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social
Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5, and is implemented by 42 CFR 400.200 to
1008.59. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family
Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and MCL
400.105.

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3151-.3180.

☐ The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 601-619, 670-679c, and 1397-1397m-5; the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, PL 101-508, 42 USC 9858 to 9858q; and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193. The program is implemented by 45 CFR 98.1-99.33. The Department administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and Mich Admin Code, R 400.5001-.5020.

Additionally, the Claimant had a redetermination due September 2013. The Claimant's Son received Social Security SSI income of \$710. Department Exhibit 13. The Claimant receives \$724 biweekly from Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB). Department Exhibit 15. The Claimant's husband has earned income of \$1,900 per month. Department Exhibit 16.

As a result of excess income, the claimant had a decrease in FAP benefits. The Claimant had a total income amount of \$4,180, resulting from earned income of \$1,900 plus unearned income of \$2,280. After deductions from her total income of \$4,180 of an earned income deduction of \$380, a \$190 standard deduction, and a child support deduction of \$240.96 for an adjusted gross income of \$3,369. The Claimant was given a total shelter deduction of \$1,453, resulting from a housing expense of \$900 and heat and utility standard of \$553. The Claimant was given an adjusted excess shelter deduction of \$0, with a total shelter deduction of \$1,453 minus 50% of adjusted gross income of \$1,684. The Claimant had a net income of \$3,369, which was the adjusted gross income of \$3,369 minus the excess shelter deduction of \$0. With a net income of \$3,369, the Claimant qualified with a household group size of 5 for a maximum benefit of \$698 plus \$0 in economic recovery minus 30% of net income of \$1,011, resulting in a net benefit amount of \$0. Department Exhibit 7-9. BEM 550. RFT 250

As a result, the Department properly closed the Claimant's FAP case due to excess income.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department

- acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed the Claimant's FAP case due to excess income.
 - did not act in accordance with Department policy when it
 - failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is

AFFIRMED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
