**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 15, 2014, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included ██████████ ██████████ Claimant's authorized hearing representative (AHR). Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ██████████ ██████████

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly process Claimant's December 7, 2011, application for Medical Assistance (MA), with request for retroactive coverage to October 2011?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On December 7, 2011, Claimant's AHR filed an MA application on Claimant's behalf, with a request for retroactive coverage to October 2011.
2. On September 12, 2013, the AHR filed a hearing request, alleging that the Department had failed to process the application.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual

(BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

As a preliminary matter, it is noted that a hearing on the September 12, 2013, hearing request was originally scheduled on December 9, 2013. An order of dismissal concerning that matter was issued on December 11, 2013. Per the AHR's request, an order to vacate the dismissal was issued on August 29, 2014, and the current hearing was scheduled in response.

At the hearing, the Department acknowledged that (i) it received the December 7, 2011, MA application with request for retroactive coverage to October 2011; (ii) it had all the verifications necessary to process the application; and (iii) it nevertheless had failed to date to process the application.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to process the December 7, 2011, application with request for retroactive coverage to October 2011. See BAM 115 (December 2011), pp. 12-13.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is REVERSED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Process Claimant's December 7, 2011, MA application with request for retroactive MA coverage to October 2011;
2. Provide Claimant with MA coverage he is eligible to receive from October 1, 2011, ongoing; and

3. Notify Claimant and the AHR in writing of its decision in a DHS-1605, Notice of Case Action.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides or has its principal place of business in the State, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
