HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a hearing was held on December 19, 2013, in Iron Mountain, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ES, and

ISSUE

With respect to the Adult Medical Assistance Program (AMP), did the Department properly close Claimant's case?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant received AMP benefits.
- 2. Claimant was not living with a spouse during the time period in question.
- 3. The total countable income of Claimant's household was during the time relevant to this matter.
- 4. The Department closed Claimant's case due to excess income.
- 5. On June 4, 2013, the Department sent notice of its decision to Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR).

- 6. On July 10, 2013, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's action with respect to AMP and with respect to the Food Assistance Program (FAP).
- 7. During the hearing, Claimant testified that she no longer requested a hearing regarding FAP.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by 42 USC 1315 and is administered by the Department pursuant to MCL 400.10. Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

Additionally, RFT 236 sets the monthly income limit for a group size of one at \$336.00. Therefore, Claimant's net income exceeded the limit. See Exhibits 2 and 3. Therefore, the Department was correct in its action. Claimant stated at the hearing that she no longer receives income. However, the Department was correct in its action with the information it had when it issued the negative Notice of Case Action.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy.

It is also noted that Claimant requested a hearing regarding the Food Assistance Program (FAP). However, Claimant testified at the hearing that she no longer requested a hearing regarding FAP.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's AMP decision is AFFIRMED.

It is further ORDERED that Claimant's hearing request regarding FAP is DISMISSED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights
 of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
