### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99. 1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a t elephone hearing was held on January 1 5, 2014, from Lanisng, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included Eligib ility Specialist.

### ISSUE

Did the Department properly close Claimant's MA and SDA benefits?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on t he competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- On March 4, 2013, a Notice of Case Action was issues regarding Claimant's MA and SDA benefits.
- 2. On March 13, 2013, Claim ant requested a hearing and that his benefits not be changed pending hearing.
- 3. A hearing was scheduled for August 1, 2013, but Claimant did not appear.
- 4. Claimant received the notice and knew that he had a hearing.
- 5. On August 2, 2013, the Michigan Administrative Hearing System issued an Order of Dismissal, advising Claimant to contact this office with any questions.
- 6. Claimant did not contact this office regarding the dismissal.
- 7. On October 23, 2013 Claim ant was denied SSA by the federal government at the Appeals Council level. (Exhibit B).

- 8. On November 15, 2013, the Department issued a Notice of Case Action cancelling Claimant's MA and SDA benefits.
- 9. The benefits were cancelled at that time due to the March 4, 2013 closure.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Service s Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), D epartment of Human Service es Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medic al Assistance (MA) program is est ablished by the Title XIX of the Socia I Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5, and is implemented by 42 CFR 400.200 to 1008.59. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and MCL 400.105.

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agenc y) administers the SDA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 an d Mich Admin Code, R 400.3151-.3180.

Additionally, Claimant had a notice and opportunity to be heard regarding the March 2013 issue but his case was dismissed. This Administrative Law Judge lacks authority to address the August 2, 2013 order of dism issal. The scheduled hearing and order of dismissal complies with BAM 600. Claimant already had an opportunity to challenge the matter during the previously scheduled hea ring and had not challenged the Order of Dismissal up to the date of the hearing.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it cancelled Claimant's MA and SDA.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

**NOTICE OF APP EAL:** The claimant may appea I the Dec ision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, i f a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsiderati on was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing S ystem (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a par ty within 30 days of the mailing date of this Dec ision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's mo tion where the final decis ion cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly disc overed evidence that existed at the time of the or iginal hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the clai mant must specify all reas ons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
