HEARING DECISION

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's application close Claimant's case for:

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for received:
 FIP FAP MA AMP SDA CDC DSS SSP benefits.
2. On November 1, 2013, the Department denied Claimant's application closed Claimant's case due to Claimant's failure to participate in work-related activities.

3. On October 11, 2013, the Department sent Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR) its decision.
4. On December 5, 2013, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and 400.57a and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101 to .3131.

Additionally, at the hearing, documentary evidence was presented that showed that Claimant had been participating with [REDACTED] Claimant's participation, while not communicated in writing to PATH, was sent to Claimant's Departmental worker assigned to her case.

It is not beyond expectations to expect that the Department would communicate with its contractual programs, especially when the result triggered the closure of Claimant's benefits.

Here, Claimant was participating in a mandatory program arising from her involvement with Child Protective Services (CPS).

This fact was communicated to the Department in a letter dated November 5, 2013. The Department testified that because the number of hours Claimant participated in Wellspring was insufficient, the closure of Claimant's FIP case was completed.

The [REDACTED] representative testified that, if Claimant's involvement with a program for CPS had been communicated, it would have been sufficient for Claimant's required participation.

The closure of Claimant's FIP, therefore, rested on the failure of the Department to communicate Claimant's mandatory involvement with [REDACTED] to her [REDACTED] representative and, thereby, using Claimant's failure to participate as the basis for closing Claimant's FIP case.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department

- acted in accordance with Department policy when it .
- did not act in accordance with Department policy when it closed Claimant's FIP case for failure to participate in work-related activities.
- failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it .


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is

- AFFIRMED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reopen Claimant's FIP case back to its closure on November 1, 2013, and supplement for any missed benefits.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;

- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
