

HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on Thursday, February 6, 2014, from Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant. Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included , ES.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's application for Adult Medical Assistance (AMP) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant applied for benefits from Adult Medical Assistance (AMP) and the Food Assistance Program (FAP).
- 2. On January 7, 2014, the Department denied Claimant's FAP application due to ineligible student status per BEM 245 and Claimant's AMP application as AMP is not open to new enrollees per BAM 130.
- 3. On January 7, 2014, the Department sent Claimant notice of the denial.
- 4. On January 11, 2014, Claimant filed a hearing request, protesting the denial of the application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), the Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and the Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp (FS) program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*, and 1997 AACS R 400.3001-3015.

The Adult Medical Program (AMP) is established by 42 USC 1315, and is administered by the Department pursuant to MCL 400.10, *et seq.*

Additionally, effective April 1, 2011, claimants in student status are no longer eligible to receive FAP benefits based solely on an approved education plan. BEM 245. A person is in student status if the person is 18 through 49 years old and enrolled half-time or more in: (i) a vocational, trade, business, or technical school that normally requires a high school diploma or an equivalency certificate; or (ii) a regular curriculum at a college or university that offers degree programs regardless of whether a diploma is required. BEM 245. In order for an individual in student status to be eligible for FAP benefits, the individual must meet one of the criteria listed in BEM 245. Here, Claimant testified that, at the time of application, she did not work at least 20 hours per week.

The Claimant confirmed at the telephone interview on January 7, 2013 that she was a full time student and unemployed. Per her testimony, she does not work 20 hours a week as is required by policy for a fulltime student to be eligible to receive FAP benefits. The Claimant is entitled to reapply for FAP benefits when she is no longer a full time student or is working 20 hours a week as a full time student. In addition, the AMP program is not open to new enrollees.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Claimant's FAP application because she was a college student, but not working at least 20 hours a week as is required by department policy to be eligible for FAP and denied Claimant's AMP application as the AMP program is not open to new enrollees.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights
 of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
