HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, 3-way telephone hearing was held on Tuesday, April 22, 2014, from Lansing, Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant's Authorized Michigan. Representative. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included , ES.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly process the Claimant's MA application filed by May 30, 2013?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On May 30, 2013, filed a filing form on behalf of the Claimant with the Department.
- 2. The Department failed to register and process the filing form submitted.
- 3. On February 20, 2014, requested a hearing on the Department's failure to register their filing form.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

Additionally, the Department failed to register and process a filing form submitted by on the Common of the Common of the Common of the Department to register and process the filing form received by May 30, 2013. BEM 210. BAM 500.
The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department identification did not act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to register and process the filing form received by L&S on May 30, 2013.
DECISION AND ORDER
Accordingly, the Department's decision is REVERSED.
☑ THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:
 Initiate a redetermination of the Claimant's eligibility for MA by registering and processing the filing form submitted by on May 30, 2013. Provide the Claimant and her Authorized Representative with written notification of the Department's revised eligibility determination. Issue the Claimant any retroactive benefits she/he may be eligible to receive, if any.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: The Claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the Claimant;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the Claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
