FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including testimony of witnesses, finds as material fact:

- 1. Claimant \boxtimes applied for: \boxtimes FAP benefits.
- Claimant was required to submit requested verification by May 19, 2014.
- 3. On June 4, 2014, the Department ⊠ denied Claimant's application.
- 4. On June 4, 2014, the Department sent Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR) notice of its action.
- 5. On June 16, 2014, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's action.

☑ The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Additionally, the Claimant applied for FAP beneifts. On . , the Department Caseworker sent the Claimant a Verification Checklist for written verification of assets that was due . Department Exhibit 13-14. The Claimant failed to provide the required verification of his asset verification of his information that was due on . As a result, the Department Caseworker sent the Claimant a notice that his FAP application was denied due to failure to provide verification. Department Exhibit 15-20. BEM 400 and 500.

The Department met their burden that the Claimant's FAP application should be denied because the Claimant failed to provide the required verification to determine FAP eligibility.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Claimant's FAP application for failure to provide asset verifications required to determine FAP eligibility.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is \boxtimes AFFIRMED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the Claimant;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
