HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 12, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included [REDACTED]. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The Claimant applied for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits on May 21, 2014.
2. The Claimant reported to the Department on her application for assistance that one of her son's is a full-time student.
3. During an interview with her caseworker, the Claimant reported that one of her son's attends a post-secondary educational program and receives work study earnings.
4. On March 24, 2014, the Department sent the Claimant a Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) requesting verification of her son's work study.
5. On June 30, 2014, the Department notified the Claimant that it had denied her application for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

6. On July 8, 2014, the Department received the Claimant's request for a hearing, protesting the denial of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5, and is implemented by 42 CFR 400.200 to 1008.59. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and MCL 400.105.

Clients must cooperate with the local office in determining initial and ongoing eligibility. This includes the completion of necessary forms. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 105 (March 1, 2013), p 5. Verification means documentation or other evidence to establish the accuracy of the client's verbal or written statements. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 130 (May 1, 2012), p 1. Verification is usually required at application/redetermination and for a reported change affecting eligibility or benefit level when it is required by policy, required as a local office option, or information regarding an eligibility factor is unclear, inconsistent, incomplete, or contradictory. BAM 130. The Department uses documents, collateral contacts, or home calls to verify information. BAM 130. A collateral contact is a direct contact with a person, organization, or agency to verify information from the client. BAM 130. When documentation is not available, or clarification is needed, collateral contact may be necessary. BAM 130.

The Claimant applied for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits on May 21, 2014. The Claimant reported to the Department on her application for assistance that one of her son's is a full time student. During a routine eligibility interview with the Department, the Claimant reported that student son attends a post-secondary educational program and receives work study earnings. On March 24, 2014, the Department sent the Claimant a Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) requesting verification of her son's work study. On June 30, 2014, the Department notified the Claimant that it would deny Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits for failure to verify the work study earnings.

As a full time student in a post-secondary educational program, the Claimant's son is required to meet the requirements of the Department's student status policy under Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 244 (July 1, 2014), pp 1-11. As a full time college student, the Claimant's son would be disqualified from the Food Assistance Program (FAP) unless he has employment or work study earnings of 20 hours per week. As a member of the Claimant's benefit group, the Department was required to seek verification of the work study earnings reported during the eligibility interview to determine the Claimant's eligibility for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

The Claimant argued that her son does not receive work study earnings, and she was mistaken about this fact during the eligibility interview.

This Administrative Law Judge finds that the Department reasonably relied on statements the Claimant made during the eligibility interview and was required to seek verification of the son's earnings. This Administrative Law Judge finds that the Claimant failed to make a reasonable effort to respond to the March 24, 2014, Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) to resolve the Department's request for information.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) application.

The Department's representative established that the Claimant has been approved for Medical Assistance (MA) and that these benefits are ongoing.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
