**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on August 19, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED].

**ISSUE**

Due to a failure to comply with the verification requirements, did the Department properly close Claimant's case for Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including testimony of witnesses, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant received FAP benefits.
2. Claimant was required to submit requested verification by June 23, 2014.
3. On June 26, 2014, the Department closed Claimant's case.
4. On June 26, 2014, the Department sent Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR) notice of its action.
5. On July 1, 2014, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's action.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Additionally, the Claimant was a recipient of FAP. On June 9, 2014, the Department Caseworker called the Claimant and got a voicemail stating that "you have reached [REDACTED]." The Department Caseworker conducted an Internet search for [REDACTED] to find out that the company was owned by the Claimant as [REDACTED] which was a food cart in the park in downtown Cadillac. The Claimant's Facebook page also confirmed his ownership of the business. Department Exhibit 11-15. As a result, the Department Caseworker was required by Department policy to confirm any income that the Claimant received.


On July 11, 2014, the Department Caseworker sent the Claimant a Quick Note, DHS-100, for written verification of self-employment that was due June 23, 2014. Department Exhibit 8. The Claimant failed to provide the required verification of his income of self-employment that was due on June 23, 2014. As a result, the Department Caseworker sent the Claimant a notice that his FAP case would be closed effective on August 1, 2014, due to failure to provide verification. MSA Bulletin 13-35 and 14-11. PA 107 of 2013. 42 CFR Parts 431, 435, 457.

The Department has met their burden that the Claimant's FAP case should be closed because the Claimant failed to provide the required verification to determine continued FAP eligibility.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed the Claimant's FAP case due to failure to provide verifications to determine continued FAP eligibility.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the Claimant;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
