HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 20, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- The Claimant is an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient.
- The Claimant receives a gross monthly income totaling \$
- 3. The Claimant has monthly shelter expense of \$ is not obligated to pay for hearting expenses, but has monthly non-heat electricity and telephone expenses.
- 4. On July 11, 2014, the Department notified the Claimant that it would decrease her monthly Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits to \$
- 5. On July 22, 2014, the Department received the Claimant's request for a hearing protesting the decrease to her Food Assistance Program (FAP) allotment.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual

(BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), all Food Assistance Program (FAP) automatically received a flat credit on their Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility budgets for a heat and utility expense. Effective May 1, 2014, Department policy requires the removal of the heat and utility expense from Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient's budgets when determining their eligibility to receive continuing benefits. Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipients that receive the heat and utility expense credit are not entitled to additional utility expense. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 554 (May 1, 2014), p 15.

The Claimant was an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) when the Department redetermined her eligibility for continuing benefits. The Claimant does not have a monthly obligation for heating and therefore is not entitled to the heat and utility expense deduction. The Department gave the Claimant credit for non-heat electricity and telephone expenses. The reduction of monthly expenses that the Claimant is entitled to on her Food Assistance Program (FAP) budget caused her monthly allotment of benefits to drop to \$\infty\$

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility as of August 1, 2014.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.
