**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 09, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included herself. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ES [REDACTED]. On the hearing request Claimant indicated she wanted a hearing about the Adult Medical Program (AMP). The AMP no longer exists so that portion of the hearing request is dismissed.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly close Claimant's Food Assistance Program beginning August 1, 2014?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. During July 2014, Claimant submitted a Redetermination (DHS-1010).
2. On July 22, 2014, Claimant submitted a hearing request because she was told that her benefits would end.
3. On July 29, 2014, Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated her Food Assistance Program would close beginning August 1, 2014 for failure to cooperate with the Office of Child Support and because she failed to provide verification of earned income.
4. On July 30, 2014, the Office of Child Support notified the Oakland District DHS Office that Claimant was in cooperation.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

In this case Claimant was verbally informed that her benefits would end due to noncooperation with child support. When the actual Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) was issued, it stated closure was due to both noncooperation with child support and failure to provide verification of earned income. Evidence in the record (Page 9) from the Office of Child Support states Claimant is in cooperation. Page 4 in the record, shows Claimant provided earned income information in the Redetermination (DHS-1010) form she submitted. There is no Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) in evidence and no direct evidence regarding earned income verification.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Claimant's Food Assistance Program beginning August 1, 2014.


### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reinstate Claimant's redetermination and determine her ongoing Food Assistance Program eligibility in accordance with Department policy.

2. Issue Claimant a current Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) showing her Food Assistance Program eligibility beginning August 1, 2014.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
