### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 25, 2014, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. # <u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly calculate and process Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On August 20, 2014, the Department sent Claimant a notice of case action informing her of an increase in her FAP benefits, as well as a subtraction from the supplemental benefits to partially make up for an overissuance of benefits.
- 2. On August 22, 2014, Claimant requested a hearing to protest the Department's calculation of her FAP benefits.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

At the hearing, the Department presented a hearing summary stating that it had corrected Claimant's earned income due to Claimant having been fired from his job in June 2014.

The Department's hearing summary also states that Claimant's FAP benefits are \$239.00, while the notice of case action lists her FAP benefits as \$216.00.

The Department's notice of case action recognizes a correction of benefits by adding a supplement of \$293.00 for the period of June 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014.

The notice of case action also addresses an overissuance and notified Claimant that the Department subtracted from the supplement to pay for a portion of the overissuance.

The Department failed to provide documentation of its calculation of Claimant's FAP benefits.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
