## **HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on November 24, 2014, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included \_\_\_\_\_\_, Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR). Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included \_\_\_\_\_, Eligibility Specialist.

### ISSUE

Did the Department properly provide notice to Claimant and his AHR regarding his February 7, 2014 application for Medical Assistance (MA) and Retroactive MA benefits?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On February 7, 2014, Claimant's AHR submitted an application for MA and Retroactive MA benefits.
- 2. On March 27, 2014, the Department denied Claimant's application for MA and Retroactive MA benefits.
- 3. Claimant's AHR did not receive notice of the denial.
- On September 2, 2014, Claimant's AHR filed a Request for Hearing disputing the 4. Department's actions.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

Additionally, when the Department receives an application for assistance, it is to be registered and processed in accordance with Department policies. The standard of promptness begins the date the Department receives an application/filing form, with minimum required information. BAM 115 (July 2013), p. 15. The Department is to certify program approval or denial of the application within 45 days and upon certification of eligibility results, the Department is to notify clients in writing of positive and negative actions by generating the appropriate notice of case action. After processing an initial application, the Department will notify clients of the approval or denial. BAM 115, pp. 13-25; BAM 220 (July 2013), pp. 1, 19-20.

In this case, Claimant's AHR testified that an application for MA benefits together with a Retroactive MA was submitted to the Department on February 7, 2014. The Department acknowledged that it received the application. Claimant's AHR testified that notice was not received regarding the Department's decision. The Department testified that on March 27, 2014 the application was denied. When a case is denied, the Department is required to send one of the following: a DHS-1605, Client Notice, or the DHS-1150, Application Eligibility Notice, with the denial reason(s). Medicaid and AMP denials receive a DHS-1606, Health Care Coverage Determination Notice. The Department representative was unable to confirm whether notice was sent to the Claimant but stated that it was likely not sent to Claimant's AHR.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with policy when it failed to provide notice of its decision regarding the February 7, 2014 application for MA and Retroactive MA benefits.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

- 1. Send notice to Claimant regarding its decision relating to the February 7, 2014 application for MA and Retroactive MA benefits; and
- 2. The notice regarding the Department's decision relating to the February 7, 2014 application for MA and Retroactive MA benefits should include a mailing date which will allow Claimant and/or his AHR to timely appeal the decision.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL**: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights
  of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
