HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on August 11, 2014, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included the Claimant and the Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative [REDACTED]. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED].

ISSUE

Due to a failure to comply with the verification requirements, did the Department properly deny Claimant's application close Claimant's case reduce Claimant's benefits for:

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including testimony of witnesses, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for received:
 FIP FAP MA SDA CDC
benefits.
2. Claimant was required to submit requested verification by June 9, 2014.

3. On May 27, 2014, the Department
 denied Claimant's application.
 closed Claimant's case.
 reduced Claimant's benefits.
4. On June 23, 2014, the Department sent Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Representative (AR) notice of its action.
5. On June 30, 2014, Claimant/Claimant's Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR) filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Additionally, in this case the Claimant's AHR credibly testified that she delivered all the requested verifications to the Department in June before the June 9, 2014 due date, and signed the sign-in book. At that time, the AHR testified that she dropped off the rent verification, front and back of the driver's license and checking account, electric bill and bank account. The Department issued a Notice of Case Action denying the FAP application because it did not receive all of the requested information. Exhibit 1. The Department indicated that the Checking account was not acceptable because it did not spell out the Claimant's name, except for his last name; the Department did not seek further verification about the checking account. The Department did not have the case file at the hearing.

At the hearing, the Department reviewed the sign-in books and found the Claimant's AHR's signature on May 28, 2014, corroborating her testimony that she dropped off the requested information before the due date.

Based up this evidence it is determined that the Claimant did provide the requested verification by the due date and that the Department erred when it denied the Claimant's FAP application. BAM 130 (7/1/14)

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any finds that the Department

did not act in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Claimant's FAP application for failure to verify information.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is

REVERSED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. The Department shall re register the Claimant 5/27/14 FAP application and process the application in accordance with Department policy.
2. The Department shall issue a FAP supplement to the Claimant for any FAP benefits, if any, the Claimant is otherwise eligible in accordance with Department policy.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
