HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a three way telephone hearing was held on October 6, 2014, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ██████████, PATH Worker, and ██████████, Family Independence Manager.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Claimant's application for Family Independence Program (FIP) benefits for failure to attend the PATH program orientation?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Claimant applied for FIP on July 7, 2014.
2. The Department scheduled Claimant to attend its mandatory PATH orientation.
3. Claimant did not receive the notice of the PATH orientation date and failed to attend orientation.
4. On August 19, 2014, the Department sent Claimant a Notice of Case Action notifying her that her application for FIP benefits had been denied.
5. September 3, 2014, Claimant filed a Request for Hearing disputing the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FIP pursuant to 45 CFR 233-260, MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101

Claimant applied for FIP benefits on July 7, 2014. Department policy holds that completion of the 21 day PATH application eligibility period (AEP) part of orientation is an eligibility requirement for approval of the FIP application. BEM 229 (July 2013), p. 1. Further, a client is required to begin the AEP by the last date to attend as indicated on the DHS-4785, PATH Appointment Notice. *Id.* The Department testified that it failed to send Claimant the PATH Appointment Notice. The Department further stated that even though a PATH Appointment Notice was not generated, a date was scheduled for Claimant to attend the PATH orientation. Claimant confirmed that she did not receive the PATH Appointment Notice following her July 7, 2014 application and therefore did not attend the PATH orientation. Therefore, it is found that the Department improperly denied Claimant's July 7, 2014 FIP application for failure to attend the PATH program orientation.

Claimant reapplied for FIP benefits on September 5, 2014. The Department testified that Claimant was sent a PATH Appointment Notice following the September 5, 2014 application and according to its records was compliant with the requirements of the PATH program.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with policy when it denied Claimant's July 7, 2014 FIP application.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reregister and reprocess Claimant's July 7, 2014 application.
2. Issue FIP supplements to Claimant relating to her July 7, 2014 application; and

3. Notify Claimant in writing with a Notice of Case Action of its decision.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
