**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 4, 2013, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included ██████████, Eligibility Specialist and ██████████, Family Independence Manager.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly calculate Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On October 7, 2013, Claimant submitted an application for FAP benefits and was approved for ██████ in monthly FAP benefits effective November 1, 2013.
2. Claimant was not in agreement with the Department's calculation of her FAP benefits.
3. On October 28, 2013, Claimant submitted a hearing request disputing the Department's actions.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 271.1 to 285.5. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Additionally, all countable earned and unearned income available to the client must be considered in determining the Claimant's eligibility for program benefits. BEM 500 (July 2013), pp. 1 – 3. The Department determines a client's eligibility for program benefits based on the client's actual income and/or prospective income. Prospective income is income not yet received but expected. BEM 505 (July 2013), p. 1. A standard monthly amount must be determined for each income source used in the budget. BEM 505, p. 7. Income received bi-weekly is converted to a standard amount by multiplying the average of the bi-weekly paychecks by the 2.15 multiplier. BEM 505, pp. 8.


At the hearing, the FAP EDG Net Income Results Budget for November 1, 2013, was reviewed. (Exhibit 2). The Department concluded that Claimant had unearned income of [REDACTED] which came from unemployment benefits. The Department stated that in calculating Claimant's unearned income from unemployment, it considered [REDACTED] in bi-weekly unemployment benefits received on September 9, 2013, and September 24, 2013. Claimant confirmed that the amounts relied on by the Department were correct. After further review, the Department properly calculated Claimant's unearned income, as the bi-weekly amount of unemployment received multiplied by the 2.15 standard multiplier results in a total of \$ [REDACTED].

The budget shows that the Department properly applied the [REDACTED] standard deduction applicable to Claimant's confirmed group size of one and that the [REDACTED] standard heat and utility deduction available to all FAP recipients was properly applied. RFT 255 (October 2013), p 1; BEM 554 (July 2013), pp. 14-15. The Department also considered housing costs of [REDACTED] which Claimant confirmed were correct.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined that Claimant had net income of [REDACTED] and that she was eligible for [REDACTED] FAP benefits, effective November 1, 2013.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

- A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:
- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
  - Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
  - Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
  - Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
