**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 16, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included himself and his daughter. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED].

**ISSUE**

Due to excess assets, did the Department properly deny Claimant's August 12, 2013, regular and retroactive Medical Assistance (MA) application?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, including the testimony at the hearing, finds as material fact:

1. On August 12, 2013, a regular and retroactive application for Medical Assistance (MA) was submitted on Claimant's behalf.
2. On September 9, 2013, Claimant was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated his application for July 2013 was denied due to excess assets.
3. On November 15, 2013, Claimant filed a hearing request, protesting the Department's actions.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are found in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).


The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by the Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5, and is implemented by 42 CFR 400.200 to 1008.59. The Department of Human Services (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers the MA program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and MCL 400.105.

During this hearing Claimant did not dispute the amount his bank account contained during July & August 2013. Claimant testified he was in the hospital and was not able to pay his bills so the account would have had less in it if he had been able to pay his bills. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 4000 Assets (2013) contains no exceptions or provisions for possibilities of bank account balances. BEM 400 page 7 states the asset limit for Claimant's application was [REDACTED]. Page 15 states the money in an account is the asset value of that account.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Claimant's August 12, 2013 regular and retroactive Medical Assistance (MA) application.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order.

MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
