**HEARING DECISION**

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 11, 2014, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED] [REDACTED].

**ISSUE**

Whether the Department of Human Services (Department) properly closed the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits because she does not meet the requirements of the student status policy?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The Claimant was an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient until February 1, 2014.
2. The Claimant is enrolled in a post-secondary educational program.
3. On December 27, 2013, the Department notified the Claimant that it would close her Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of February 1, 2014.
4. The Department received the Claimant's request for a hearing on January 9, 2014, protesting the closure of her Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 271.1 to 285.5. The

Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

A person in student status must meet certain criteria in order to be eligible for food assistance. Requirements to remain eligible for the Food Assistance Program (FAP) include working at least 20 hours per week, participating in a work study program, or providing care for a minor child. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 245 (July 1, 2013), pp 1-10.

The Claimant was an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient when the Department discovered that she had been approved for the Food Assistance Program (FAP) due to Department error. On December 27, 2013, the Department notified the Claimant that it would close her Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of February 1, 2014.


The Claimant is enrolled in a post-secondary educational program. The Claimant failed to establish that she meets the requirements to participate in the Food Assistance Program (FAP) under the student status policy. Therefore, the Department was acting in accordance when it closed the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed the Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.

**NOTICE OF APPEAL:** The claimant may appeal the Decision and Order to Circuit Court within 30 days of the receipt of the Decision and Order or, if a timely Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration was made, within 30 days of the receipt date of the Decision and Order of Reconsideration or Rehearing Decision.

Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) may order a rehearing or reconsideration on either its own motion or at the request of a party within 30 days of the mailing date of this Decision and Order. MAHS will not order a rehearing or reconsideration on the Department's motion where the final decision cannot be implemented within 90 days of the filing of the original request (60 days for FAP cases).

A Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration may be granted when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The Department, AHR or the claimant must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date the hearing decision is mailed.
