HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on April 2, 2015, in Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included Claimant. Participants on behalf of the Department of Human Services (Department) included [REDACTED], Success Coach, and [REDACTED], Assistance Worker.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly calculate Claimant's Food Assistance Program (FAP) allotment?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Department notified Claimant that her FAP allotment was \$558.00.
2. On [REDACTED], Claimant requested a hearing, protesting the amount of her FAP allotment.
3. During the hearing, the Department presented budgets showing calculations of Claimant's FAP allotment that did not equal \$558.00.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual

(BEM), Department of Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Family Independence Agency) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

In the present case, on [REDACTED], the Department notified Claimant that her FAP allotment was \$558.00. On [REDACTED], Claimant requested a hearing, protesting the amount of her FAP allotment. During the hearing, the Department presented budgets showing calculations of Claimant's FAP allotment that did not equal \$558.00. Therefore, the Department did not substantiate that it was correct in determining Claimant's FAP allotment to be \$558.00.

It is noted that Claimant's hearing request noted discrepancies in her FAP allotment prior to [REDACTED], but this Administrative Law Judge does not have jurisdiction to hear issues occurring prior to [REDACTED], as shown below:

Regulations governing the hearing and appeal process for applicants and recipients of public assistance in Michigan are found in Mich Admin Code, R 400.901 through R 400.951. Rule 400.903(1) provides as follows:

An opportunity for a hearing shall be granted to an applicant who requests a hearing because [a] claim for assistance is denied or is not acted upon with reasonable promptness, and to any recipient who is aggrieved by a Department action resulting in suspension, reduction, discontinuance, or termination of assistance.

A request for hearing must be in writing and signed by the claimant, petitioner, or authorized representative. Mich Admin Code, R 400.904(1). Moreover, the Department of Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM) 600 (10/2014), p. 6, provides in relevant part as follows:

The client or authorized hearing representative has 90 calendar days from the date of the written notice of case action to request a hearing. The request must be received anywhere in DHS within the 90 days. [Emphasis added.]

.....

For FAP only, the client or AHR may request a hearing disputing the current level of benefits at any time within the benefit period. (Emphasis added.)

In the present case, the Department issued a Notice of Case Action on [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and Claimant requested a hearing on [REDACTED], within 90 days of the Notice of Case Action. Any issues prior to the Notice of Case Action of [REDACTED], [REDACTED] will not be addressed herein, due to lack of jurisdiction.

Claimant also raised issues regarding professionalism of the staff, which issues are beyond the scope of jurisdiction of this administrative law judge.

It is also noted that the Department submitted documentation regarding Claimant's Family Independence Program (FIP) case, but Claimant stated at the hearing that her request for hearing was solely based on her FAP case.


The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it calculated Claimant's FAP allotment.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Re-calculate Claimant's FAP allotment, effective [REDACTED]
2. Notify Claimant in writing of the Department's determination.
3. Issue FAP supplements for any increased payment.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS **MAY** order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS **MAY** grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
