HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10 After due notice, telephone hearing was held on May 12, 2015, from Lansing, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included **Exercise**. Participants on behalf of the Department included **Exercise**.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly close the Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) benefits due to excess income?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The Claimant was an ongoing Medical Assistance (MA) recipient under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) until April 1, 2015.
- 2. On February 10, 2013, the Department initiated a routine review of the Claimant's eligibility for continuing MA benefits.
- 3. The Claimant receives monthly earned income from employment in the gross monthly amount of \$
- 4. On March 5, 2015, the Department notified the Claimant that it would close her MA benefits as of April 1, 2015.
- 5. On March 19, 2015, the Department received the Claimant's request for a hearing protesting the closure of her Medical Assistance (MA) benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

The income limit to participate in the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) is 133% of the federal poverty rate. Department of Health and Human Services Reference Table Manual (RFT) 246 (April 1, 2014), p 1.

The Department of Health and Human Services Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) Related Eligibility Manual includes the following guidelines for determining eligibility for MAGI related MA benefits¹:

5% Disregard

- The 5% disregard is the amount equal to 5% of the Federal Poverty Level for the applicable family size.
- It is not a flat 5% disregard from the income.
- The 5% disregard shall be applied to the highest income threshold.
- The 5% disregard shall be applied only if required to make someone eligible for Medicaid.

The Claimant was an ongoing MA recipient in the HMP category when the Department reviewed her eligibility for continuing benefits. The Claimant is employed and receives earned income from employment in the gross monthly amount of **Sector** which was determined from the two bi-weekly pay-check stubs submitted by the Claimant with each showing verified earnings of **Sector**

This Administrative Law Judge finds that applying a 5% disregard to the Federal Poverty Level for a group of two between the age of 19 – 64 would make the Claimant eligible for benefits under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) assuming she meet all other criteria.

15-004503/KS The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it closed the Claimant's Medical Assistance (MA) benefits under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) based on excess income.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

- 1. Initiate a determination of the Claimant's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) effective April 1, 2015.
- 2. Provide the Claimant with a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) describing the Department's revised eligibility determination.
- 3. Issue the Claimant any retroactive benefits she may be eligible to receive, if any.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date.

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS <u>MAY</u> order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion.

MAHS <u>MAY</u> grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.
