HEARING DECISION

Following Claimant's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a 3 way telephone hearing was held on July 22, 2015, from Detroit, Michigan. Participants on behalf of Claimant included of the Claimant did not appear. Participants on behalf of the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) included FIS.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly process the Claimant's application for Medical Assistance?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The Department was ordered to reregister and reprocess the Claimant's Retroactive MA application of retroactive to January 2013. The Order was a result of a hearing held on Judge Susan Burke.
- The Department processed the application for May 2013 and as of the hearing the Department had not activated coverage for January 2013. The Claimant's AHR was not sent a copy of the Health Care Coverage Determination Notice issued by the Department in May 2015.
- 3. The Claimant's AHR requested a timely hearing on Department's failure to process.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, the evidence presented by the Department demonstrated that it improperly processed the Claimant's retroactive MA application for May 2013 instead of April 2013. The Department did not process the application as a retroactive application for January 2013. The Department failed to meet its burden of proof that coverage was effective for January 2013.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it process the Claimant retroactive application and failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it did not activate MA coverage for January 2013.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is

REVERSED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. The Department shall correct and re process the Claimant's Retroactive MA application of retroactive to January 2013.

2. The Department shall notify the Claimant and the Claimant's Authorized hearing Representative in writing of its determination regarding retroactive MA eligibility.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date. A copy of the claim or application for appeal must be filed with the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS).

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from MAHS within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS <u>MAY</u> order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion. MAHS <u>MAY</u> grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client:
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.
