HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner appeared pro se through an interpreter. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Hearings Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Medical Assistance eligibility?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On August 1, 2015, Petitioner had a MA redetermination.
- 2. At that time, it was determined that Petitioner had been erroneously receiving full MA services, and Petitioner was transferred to Emergency Services Only (ESO) MA.
- 3. Petitioner is not a citizen of the United States, is a permanent resident, does not a have a full MA applicable residency status, and has not been in the country for five years or more.
- 4. On August 28, 2015, Petitioner requested a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

Policy found in BEM 225 governs MA eligibility for non-citizens. Specifically, a noncitizen must have been a permanent legal resident of the United States for five years or more, or have a qualifying residency status (as listed in BEM 225), to be found eligible for full MA services. Other residents are eligible for ESO MA.

Per the evidence presented (Department Exhibit 4), Petitioner does not have a qualifying residence status, and has not been in the country for five years or more. While Petitioner has received full MA services in the past, it appears that this may have been error; regardless, the undersigned can only examine whether the Department's present actions were correct, and per policy Petitioner is only eligible for ESO services.

Therefore, the Department did not err when it found Petitioner eligible for ESO MA benefits.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it found Petitioner eligible for ESO MA benefits only.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

A copy of the claim or application for appeal must be filed with the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS).

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from MAHS within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS <u>MAY</u> order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion. MAHS <u>MAY</u> grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
