**HEARING DECISION**

Upon the request for a hearing by the Department of Health and Human Services (Department), this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9, and in accordance with Titles 7, 42 and 45 of the Code of Federal Regulation (CFR), particularly 7 CFR 273.16 and 45 CFR 235.110; and with Mich Admin Code, R 400.3130 and 400.3178. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 14, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Department was represented by Recoupment Specialist [REDACTED]. Respondent did not appear.

**ISSUE**

Did Respondent receive an overissuance of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The Department submitted Exhibit A, pages 1-37 with no objection. (Dept. Exh. A, pp 1-37).
2. Respondent applied for FAP on April 19, 2014 and was a recipient of FAP benefits from the Department at all times pertinent to this hearing. (Dept. Exh. A, pp 21-37).

3. The Department alleges Respondent received a FAP overissuance during the period April 1, 2014, through September 30, 2014, due to Respondent's failure to report her husband's disability income. (Hearing Summary; Dept. Exh. A, p 3).
4. The Department alleges that Respondent received a [REDACTED] overissuance that is still due and owing to the Department. (Dept. Exh. A, p 3, 6-20).

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

Departmental policy, BAM 700, Benefit Overissuances, states that when a client group receives more benefits than entitled to receive, the Department must attempt to recoup the overissuance. BAM 700, p 1 (1/1/2016). Repayment of an overissuance is the responsibility of anyone who was an eligible, disqualified, or other adult in the program group at the time the overissuance occurred. BAM 725, p 1 (10/1/2015). Bridges will collect from all adults who were a member of the case. *Id.*


In this case, Respondent failed to report her husband's disability income from MET. As a result, Respondent's husband's unearned income was not budgeted. Because Respondent failed to properly report her husband's unearned income, Respondent received an overissuance of [REDACTED] for the period of April 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, finds that the Department did establish a FAP benefit overissuance to Respondent totaling [REDACTED].

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department is AFFIRMED.

The Department is ORDERED to initiate collection procedures for a [REDACTED] overissuance in accordance with Department policy.
