HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 10, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED]. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearing Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny the Petitioner's December 16, 2015, application for Food Assistance Program (FAP) and Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On December 16, 2015, the Petitioner applied for FAP and MA benefits.
2. On January 7, 2016, the Department conducted an interview with the Petitioner.
3. On January 12, 2016, the Department sent the Petitioner a Verification Checklist (VCL) with a due date of January 22, 2016, requesting bank and employment information/verification.
4. On January 12, 2016, the Department sent the Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing the Petitioner that [REDACTED],

██████████ and ██████████ were eligible for full MA coverage under (MIChild).

5. On February 2, 2016, the Department denied the Petitioner's FAP and MA application for failure to provide the requested verifications.
6. On January 25, 2016, Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the denial of his December 16, 2015, FAP and MA application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.


In this case, the Petitioner provided some of the requested verifications but not all; and the Department denied the Petitioner's December 16, 2015, MA and FAP application for failure to provide requested verifications. (BAM 130).

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Petitioner's FAP benefits and placed the minor children under (MIChild).

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
