### HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 29, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. Petitioner appeared for the hearing and represented herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by

#### ISSUE

Did the Department properly close Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) case on the basis that she failed to verify requested information?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was an ongoing recipient of MA benefits.
- 2. On October 10, 2015, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice advising her that effective November 1, 2015, she was ineligible for MA benefits on the basis that she failed to provide information requested in the verification checklist (VCL). (Exhibit A)
- 3. The Department did not send Petitioner a VCL or other requests for verifications prior to the closure of her MA case.

4. On December 3, 2015, Petitioner requested a hearing to dispute the Department's actions with respect to her MA case.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

Additionally, verification is usually required at application/redetermination and for a reported change affecting eligibility or benefit level. BAM 130 (July 2015), p.1. To request verification of information, the Department sends a verification checklist (VCL) which tells the client what verification is required, how to obtain it, and the due date. BAM 130, p. 3. Although the client must obtain the required verification, the Department must assist if a client needs and requests help. If neither the client nor the Department can obtain the verification despite a reasonable effort, the Department is to use the best available information; and if no evidence is available, the Department is to use its best judgment. BAM 130, p. 3.

With respect to MA cases, clients are given 10 calendar days to provide the verifications requested by the Department. BAM 130, pp.7-8. If the client cannot provide the verification despite a reasonable effort, the Department is to extend the time limit to submit the verifications up to two times. BAM 130, p. 7-8. Extensions may be granted when the client or authorized representative make a request, when the need for the extension and the reasonable efforts taken to obtain the verifications are documented, and every effort by the Department was made to assist the client in obtaining the verifications. BAM 130, p. 7. Verifications are considered to be timely if received by the date they are due. BAM 130, p.7-8. The Department will send a negative action notice when the client indicates refusal to provide a verification, or the time period given has elapsed. BAM 130, p. 8.

In the present case, the Department acknowledged during the hearing that the closure of Petitioner's MA case effective November 1, 2015, was improper because it failed to issue a VCL or similar request for verification to Petitioner prior to the case closure.

Thus, Petitioner did not fail to verify requested information as alleged in the Health Care Coverage Determination Notice dated October 10, 2015. It was established at the hearing that subsequent to Petitioner's hearing request, the Department sent her a VCL dated December 14, 2015, which Petitioner timely responded to and provided the requested documentation. As of the hearing date however, the Department had not processed the verifications, or reinstated Petitioner's MA case, as it remained in closed status according to the eligibility summary. (Exhibit B).

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's MA case on the basis that she failed to verify requested information.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

- 1. Reinstate Petitioner's MA case effective November 1, 2015;
- 2. Provide Petitioner with MA coverage from November 1, 2015, ongoing; and
- 3. Notify Petitioner in writing of its decision.
