# HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 14, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by the Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by

Family Independence Specialists (FIS),

and , Partnership.Accountability.Training.HOPE. (PATH).

## <u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly close the Petitioner's Family Independence Program (FIP)?

## FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The Department sent the Petitioner a notice of noncompliance on October 27, 2015, and scheduled a meeting with the Department and Petitioner for November 4, 2015,
- 2. On November 10, 2015, the Department sent the Petitioner a second noncompliance notice, which also scheduled a meeting with the Department on November 18, 2015.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), agrees with the Department.

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FIP pursuant to 45 CFR 233-260, MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101-.3131.

The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 601-619, 670-679c, and 1397-1397m-5; the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, PL 101-508, 42 USC 9858 to 9858q; and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193. The program is implemented by 45 CFR 98.1-99.33. The Department administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and Mich Admin Code, R 400.5001-.5020.

#### The FIP Issue

In this case, the Petitioner, testified that she never received the first notice of noncompliance.

The Petitioner further testified that she presented the requested documentation for the second notice in a timely manner.

The Department challenged the Petitioner's testimony saying that the Department never received the information. Upon further exploration, the Department testified that it had located the documents pertaining to the second notice of noncompliance.

## The Child Care and Development (CDC) Issue

Both the Department and the Petitioner agree that the Department had correctly reinstated the Petitioner's CDC benefits.

Therefore, the request for a hearing on the CDC issue is DISMISSED.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to process the Petitioner's documentation that the Department had requested.

## DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reinstate the Petitioner's FIP benefits and supplement for any missed benefits.
