HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 4, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED]

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close Petitioner's FAP benefits for failure to return the Redetermination?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Department sent Petitioner a Redetermination which was due to be completed and returned on or before [REDACTED].
2. Petitioner returned the Redetermination on [REDACTED].
3. The Department failed to process Petitioner's Redetermination.
4. On [REDACTED], Petitioner re-applied for FAP benefits.
5. Petitioner's application was approved and he received prorated FAP benefits for January 2016.

6. Petitioner did not receive any FAP benefits from [REDACTED].
7. On [REDACTED], Petitioner filed a Request for Hearing disputing the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Additionally, the Department is required to periodically redetermine or renew an individual's eligibility for active programs. The redetermination process includes thorough review of all eligibility factors. BAM 210 (July 2015), p. 1. Further, the group loses its right to uninterrupted FAP benefits if it fails to do any of the following:

- File the FAP redetermination by the timely filing date.
- Participate in the scheduled interview.
- Submit verifications timely, provided the requested submittal date is **after** the timely filing date. BAM 210, p. 18.

In this case, the Department acknowledged that Petitioner returned the Redetermination before the due date. The Department further acknowledged that it never processed Petitioner's timely Redetermination. Petitioner reapplied for benefits on [REDACTED]. As a result, Petitioner received prorated benefits for January 2016 and full benefits beginning February 2016. However, Petitioner did not receive any benefits from August 2015 through [REDACTED]. The Department agreed that Petitioner was entitled to supplements from August 2015 through [REDACTED].

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's FAP benefits for failure to return the Redetermination.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reinstate Petitioner's FAP benefits effective [REDACTED], ongoing;
2. Issue supplements to Petitioner that he was eligible to receive but did not effective [REDACTED], ongoing;
3. Notify Petitioner of its decision in writing.
