HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 2, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was present and testified on her own behalf. The Department was represented by Assisted Payments Supervisor and Assisted Payments Worker.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine the Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. The Petitioner was a recipient of MA and the MA Cost Savings Program (CSP).
- 2. On September 15, 2015, the Department sent the Petitioner a Redetermination Application, DHS 1010, for the Petitioner to complete that was due on October 1, 2015. Department Exhibit 4-9.
- 3. On October 21, 2015, the Department received the signed Redetermination Application from the Petitioner.
- 4. On October 26, 2015, the Department received a hearing request from the Petitioner, contesting the Department's negative action.

5. On October 30, 2015, the Department Caseworker completed the Redetermination telephone interview with the Petitioner and the sent her a notice that her yearly redetermination had been completed and processed and that her benefits would continue. Department Exhibit 10-16.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, The Petitioner was a recipient of MA and the MA Cost Savings Program (CSP). On September 15, 2015, the Department sent the Petitioner a Redetermination Application, DHS 1010, for the Petitioner to complete that was due on October 1, 2015. Department Exhibit 4-9. On October 21, 2015, the Department received the signed Redetermination Application from the Petitioner. On October 26, 2015, the Department received a hearing request from the Petitioner, contesting the Department's negative action. On October 30, 2015, the Department Caseworker completed the Redetermination telephone interview with the Petitioner and the sent her a notice that her yearly redetermination had been completed and processed and that her benefits would continue. Department Exhibit 10-16. The Petitioner did not lose any benefits because her redetermination was completed before the end of the month. Her MA benefits continued. BAM 210.

During the hearing, the Petitioner stated that she had an issue with her MA spend down/deductible being . It has been that amount for over a year. The Department did correctly budget her income. The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it correctly processed the Petitioner's Redetermination Application for MA and the MA CSP.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.

NOTICE OF APPEAL: A party may appeal this Hearing Decision in the circuit court in the county in which he/she resides, or the circuit court in Ingham County, within 30 days of the receipt date. A copy of the claim or application for appeal must be filed with the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS).

A party may request a rehearing or reconsideration of this Hearing Decision from MAHS within 30 days of the mailing date of this Hearing Decision, or MAHS may order a rehearing or reconsideration on its own motion. MAHS may grant a party's Request for Rehearing or Reconsideration when one of the following exists:

- Newly discovered evidence that existed at the time of the original hearing that could affect the outcome of the original hearing decision;
- Misapplication of manual policy or law in the hearing decision which led to a wrong conclusion;
- Typographical, mathematical or other obvious error in the hearing decision that affects the rights of the client;
- Failure of the ALJ to address in the hearing decision relevant issues raised in the hearing request.

The party requesting a rehearing or reconsideration must specify all reasons for the request. MAHS will not review any response to a request for rehearing/reconsideration. A request must be *received* in MAHS within 30 days of the date this Hearing Decision is mailed.
