HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a/an telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearings Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close the Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the closure of her MA benefits.
2. On [REDACTED] the Department sent the Petitioner a Redetermination Form to be completed by [REDACTED].
3. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner's employer a verification form to be filled out by her employer.
4. On [REDACTED], the Department also sent a Verification Checklist (VCL) requesting information about the Petitioner's income.

5. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the denial of her MA benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, the Department began the redetermination process by sending the Petitioner a Redetermination Form due [REDACTED].

On [REDACTED], the Department sent a verification of employment form to the Petitioner's lawyer and a VCL sent to the Petitioner.

Here, the Petitioner's employer returned the verification of employment form in a timely manner and listed the Petitioner's work hours and income.

The Petitioner testified at the hearing that once verification of employment had been returned to the Department the Petitioner was unaware that there was any further information necessary.

The Petitioner complied with every request made by the Department except for completing the information requested on the VCL because the Petitioner believed the information included in the verification of employment was sufficient, showing her income.

During the hearing, the Department acknowledged that it had received the verification of employment a timely manner. The Department also had the income information it had requested from the Petitioner from the Petitioner's employer on the employment verification form.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department **did not** act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to utilize the information provided by the Petitioner's employer.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reinstatement of the Petitioner's MA benefits effective [REDACTED], and supplement for any missed benefits.
