DECISION AND ORDER

This matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 42 CFR 431.200 *et seq.*, upon the Petitioner's request for a hearing.

After due notice, a telephone conference hearing was held on _____. Petitioner appeared and testified.

, Appeals Review Officer, represented the Department of Health and Human Services (Respondent or Department). , Medicaid Utilization Analyst, appeared as a witness on behalf of the Respondent.

ISSUE

Did the Respondent properly deny Petitioner's request for prior authorization (PA) for complete upper and lower dentures?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the competent, material and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner is a year-old male beneficiary of the SSI and Medicaid programs.
- 2. On Petitioner's dentist completed a PA request for complete upper and lower dentures. (Exhibit A.8).
- A State of Michigan data base report from the Respondent indicates that a dentist applied for payment for a complete upper and complete lower dentures on behalf of Petitioner on (and received payment on). (Exhibit A.9).

- 4. On **the** Respondent issued a denial for complete upper and lower dentures on the grounds that the State of Michigan paid for placement for a complete upper and lower dentures on **the**, and that complete or partial dentures are not authorized when a previous prosthesis has been provided within 5 years. (Exhibit A.607).
- 5. On **Marcon**, the Michigan Administrative Hearing System (MAHS) received Petitioner's Request for Hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Medical Assistance Program is established pursuant to Title XIX of the Social Security Act and is implemented by Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). It is administered in accordance with state statute, the Social Welfare Act, the Administrative Code, and the State Plan under Title XIX of the Social Security Act Medical Assistance Program.

1.10 PRIOR AUTHORIZATION

Medicaid requires prior authorization (PA) to cover certain services before those services are rendered to the beneficiary. The purpose of PA is to review the medical need for certain services....

> Medicaid Provider Manual, (MPM) Practitioner, January 1, 2013,¹ page 4.

Under the general policy instructions for Medicaid related dental services the MPM sets replacement schedules for denture repair and replacement:

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Complete and partial dentures are benefits for all beneficiaries. All dentures require PA. Providers must assess the beneficiary's general oral health and provide a five-year prognosis for the prosthesis requested. An upper partial denture PA request must also include the prognosis of six sound teeth.

Complete or partial dentures are authorized:

- If there is one or more anterior teeth missing;
- If there are less than eight posterior teeth in occlusion (fixed bridges and dentures are to be considered occluding teeth); or
- Where an existing complete or partial denture cannot be made serviceable through repair, relining, adjustment, or duplicating (rebasing) procedures. If a partial denture can be made serviceable, the dentist should provide the needed restorations to maintain use of the existing partial, extract teeth, add teeth to an existing partial, and remove hyperplastic tissue....

Reimbursement for a complete or partial denture includes all necessary adjustments, relines, repairs, and duplications within six months of insertion. This includes such services for an immediate upper denture when authorized.

If a complete or partial denture requires an adjustment, reline, repair, or duplication within six months of insertion, but the services were not provided until after six months of insertion, no additional reimbursement is allowed for these services.

Complete or partial dentures are not authorized when:

- <u>A previous prosthesis has been provided within five</u> <u>years</u>, whether or not the existing denture was obtained through Medicaid.
- An adjustment, reline, repair, or duplication will make them serviceable.
- Replacement of a complete or partial denture that has been lost or broken beyond repair is not a benefit within five years, whether or not the existing denture was obtained through Medicaid.

MPM, Dental, §6.6A, January 1, 2013, pp. 17, 18

At the hearing the Respondent witness testified that Petitioner's request was denied for failure to meet policy requirements for prosthesis replacement on a 5-year rotation as cited above. The Department's/Respondent evidence indicates that Petitioner had complete upper and lower dentures placed on **Example**. The 5 year rule is from this date of placement.

Petitioner argues that he lost the upper dentures the day they were placed by throwing them in the garbage. Petitioner also argues that the process for obtaining the dentures started before placement and adds up to more than 5 years.

Under the MPM, dentures that were lost are not a grounds for replacement prior to the 5 year rule. (Exhibit A.11).

Here, the Respondent does not dispute Petitioner's arguments. However, Petitioner had no law or policy that would entitled him to prevail. As the case stands, the evidence that is admitted shows that under the 5 year rule policy, the Respondent is not allowed to pay for and/or authorize a second set of dentures within the 5 year rule period time pursuant to federal and state law. As such, this ALJ must uphold the denial based on the evidence of record.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, decides that the Respondent properly denied the Petitioner's request for complete upper and lower dentures based on the evidence of record.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

The Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
