### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearings Facilitator.

### **ISSUE**

Did the Department properly deny the Petitioner's State Disability Assistance (SDA), Family Independence Program (FIP) and State Emergency Relief (SER)?

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner applied for cash assistance (FIP and SDA).
2. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a Verification Checklist requesting various pieces of information/proof by [REDACTED].
3. The Petitioner was unable to provide documentation of the fact that he had applied for Supplemental Security Income (SSI), which must be done before receiving SDA benefits from the state of Michigan.

4. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the denial of his application for FIP, SDA, and SER and an SER.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FIP pursuant to 45 CFR 233-260, MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101-.3131.

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The Department of Health and Human Services (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the SDA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3151-.3180.

#### **The Cash Issues**

The Petitioner applied for FIP and SDA and was asked to provide various forms for information including documentation that the Petitioner had applied for SSI benefits. The SSI application is necessary to show that the Petitioner pursued other sources of benefits. (BEM 270, July, 2015).

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The SER program is administered by the Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.7001-.7049.


The Department testified that they had no evidence that an SER application had been filed by Petitioner. Without evidence to the contrary, the SER application is DISMISSED.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Petitioner's FIP and SDA benefits.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
