HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], [REDACTED] from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED]. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED] Hearings Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. The Petitioner applied for FAP.
2. On [REDACTED], Department sent the Petitioner a redetermination form due [REDACTED].
3. On [REDACTED] 016, the Department sent the Petitioner a Notice of Case Action approving Petitioner's application for FAP benefits.
4. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a Notice of Case Action approving the Petitioner's FAP benefits for \$ [REDACTED] a month.

5. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the amount of her FAP benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Petitioner applied for FAP benefits on [REDACTED].

The Department sent the Petitioner a redetermination form that was not returned. Subsequently, the Petitioner contacted Department informing them that she had not receive the redetermination form; and the Department sent the second redetermination form.

At the hearing, Petitioner testified that she had some problems keeping things organized but since had found someone to help her.

Department policy demands that clients provide information as requested by the Department to determine the eligibility of all applicants. (BAM 130).

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it approved the Petitioner's FAP benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
