HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 17, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Hearing Facilitator and Residue Region (Department).

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for FAP benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. is an ongoing FAP recipient.
- 2. On Petitioner, the Department processed a Redetermination submitted by Petitioner.
- 3. The Department determined Petitioner's eligibility based upon her earnings prior to her injury.
- 4. On the Department sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action which informed Petitioner that she had been approved for FAP benefits in the amount of per month.

5. On Region of the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Code, R 400.30013011.
Additionally, the Department is required to periodically redetermine or renew an individual's eligibility for active programs. The redetermination process includes thorough review of all eligibility factors. BAM 210 (January 2016), p. 1. In this case, Petitioner submitted a Redetermination which was processed by the Department on Petitioner suffered a work related injury. Prior to the injury, Petitioner earned per week. On Petitioner began receiving worker's compensation in the amount of per week.
The Department testified that it calculated Petitioner's eligibility for FAP benefits based upon the amount she earned prior to her injury. Petitioner confirmed that she receives per week and not per week and not a such, the Department used the incorrect unearned income amount in determining Petitioner's eligibility for FAP benefits.
The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it decreased Petitioner's FAP benefits to

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Redetermine Petitioner's eligibility for FAP benefits beginning

2. Issue any supplement's Petitioner was entitled to receive but did not effective ; and

3. Notify Petitioner of its decision, in writing.
