#### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9, and in accordance with Titles 7, 42 and 45 of the Code of Federal Regulation (CFR), particularly 7 CFR 273.16 and 45 CFR 235.110; and with Mich Admin Code, R 400.3130 and 400.3178. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 28, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Department was represented by Recoupment Specialist. The Petitioner appeared on her own behalf.

#### ISSUE

Did Petitioner receive an over-issuance (OI) of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

# **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was a recipient of FAP benefits from the Department.
- 2. The Department alleges Petitioner received a FAP OI during the period February 1, 2011, through August 31, 2011, due to Department error.
- 3. The Department alleges that Petitioner received \$ OI that is still due and owing to the Department.
- 4. On March 3, 2016, the Department mailed a Notice of Overissuance (Exhibit 1 Pages 5-9), informing Petitioner of the alleged OI.

5. On March 22, 2016, the Department received Petitioner's hearing request, protesting the OI.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

The Department presented evidence that Petitioner was an on-going FAP recipient. On February 11 and 16, 2011, and July 28, 2011, Petitioner submitted earnings statements (Pages 29-32) in which she reported wages. The Department did not update her FAP budget to account for those earnings, and she continued receiving per month in FAP when her FAP should have been reduced each month. See the budgets at Pages 12-20. Inexplicably, the Department provided budgets only for the months of February, March, April, and July of 2011. It has not provided budgets for May, June, or August of 2011, even though those months are shown in the Issuance Summary (Page 12). The provided budgets show an OI of for February, for March, for April, and for July. The total OI that has been established is \$\frac{1}{2}\$.

As stated in BAM 700 (1/1/16) p 1, "When a client group receives more benefits than it is entitled to receive, MDHHS must attempt to recoup the overissuance." That is true regardless of whether the error was a "client error" or an "agency error." The policy contains the imperative "must attempt to recoup the overissuance." There is no discretion on the part of the Department or the Administrative Law Judge.

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, finds that the Department established a FAP benefit OI to Petitioner totaling.

## **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department is MODIFIED.

The Department is ORDERED to reduce the amount of OI to be recouped from to \$ ...

The Department is ORDERED to initiate collection procedures for a \$ OI in accordance with Department policy.
