### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on October 4, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by her authorized representative, from The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Assistance Payments Worker and Independence Manager.

### **ISSUE**

Did the Department properly determine that the Petitioner had excess income for Healthy Michigan Program (HMP)?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On June 14, 2016, the Petitioner applied for HMP. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 23-35.
- Subsequently, the Department received the income verification for the Petitioner to determine that she had excess income for HMP due to an annual income of Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 16-22. There was no budget provided by the Department in the hearing packet or at the hearing

- 3. On July 12, 2016, the Department sent the Petitioner and her authorized representative a notice that she had excess income for HMP. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 51-54.
- 4. On August 26, 2016, the Department received a hearing request from the Petitioner's authorized representative contesting the Department's negative action.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

During the hearing, the Department Caseworker attempted to explain the budget. There was a problem when she could only calculate . As a result, the Department has not met their burden that they correctly determined the Petitioner's eligibility for HMP benefits.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined that the Petitioner had excess income for HMP and denied her application. Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Initiate a redetermination of the Petitioner's eligibility for HMP retroactive to her application of June 14, 2016.
