HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on November 3, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by himself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by FIM. Department Exhibit 1, pp.1-19 was received and admitted.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was a recipient of FAP benefits receiving \$ per month.
- 2. On September 26, 2016, Notice of Case Action was sent to Petitioner informing him that his FAP benefit would be reduced to per month.
- 3. Petitioner requested hearing on September 30, 2016, disputing the reduction in his FAP benefits.
- 4. Petitioner has \$ in unearned income.

5. Petitioner has rental obligation of \$ per month and is responsible for heat and utilities.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Deadlines for Requesting a Hearing

All Programs

The client or AHR has 90 calendar days from the date of the written notice of case action to request a hearing. The request must be received in the local office within the 90 days. BAM 600

In this case, Petitioner receives \$ per month in gross income from SSI and the State Supplement. Petitioner has rental obligation of \$ per month and is responsible for heat and utilities. Petitioner receives an excess shelter deduction of \$ per month. After subtracting the \$ standard deduction and the \$ excess shelter deduction, Petitioner has net income of \$ per month. An individual with \$ per month net income is entitled to \$ in FAP benefits. RFT 260 This was the amount determined by the Department and it was proper and correct. BEM 556

Petitioner raised issues with regard to the determination of his FAP benefits in the spring of 2016 and in 2015. It was explained that the undersigned Administrative Law Judge only has jurisdiction to address Department action that was taken within 90 days of the request for hearing. BAM 600

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's FAP benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
