**HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED] and her daughter, [REDACTED], who also acted as interpreter. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED] Hearings Facilitator.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly calculate the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) and Medical Assistance (MA) benefits?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a Notice of Case Action informing the Petitioner that her FAP benefits had been reduced to \$ [REDACTED] per month.
2. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the amount of her FAP benefits constantly fluctuating and the MA coverage for her children.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, the Department erred when it listed one of the Petitioner's children as receiving benefits in another case. After reviewing the case, the Department discovered that [REDACTED] was not this Petitioner's child and has been removed from the case.

The removal of this child and the child support that was being budgeted from this Petitioner's benefits, increased this Petitioner's FAP benefits.

The Department testified that all of the Petitioner's children, once they were correctly assigned, are now receiving full MA benefits.

The Department also provided and testified that it had produced a new FAP budget that increased the Petitioner's monthly FAP amount from \$ [REDACTED] to \$ [REDACTED] monthly.

This ALJ reviewed the new FAP budget with the Petitioner and found it to be correct.

The Department testified that the Petitioner had failed to provide shelter expense information that would also increase the Petitioner's FAP benefits. (BEM 554, June 2016).

The Petitioner was encouraged and noticed that she should provide the Department new shelter expense documentation.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it provided MA coverage for the Petitioner's children and increased her FAP benefits effective [REDACTED].

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
