HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner and his Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR), The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Payments Supervisor.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny the Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) application?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On the Petitioner applied for MA benefits.
- 2. On Bank provided an account summary showing the Petitioner having \$ in checking and \$ in savings, for a total of
- 3. On _____, the Department sent the Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing him that his MA application had been denied for excess assets.
- 4. On the Petitioner's AHR requested a hearing to protest the denial of the Petitioner's MA application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, documentation shows the Petitioner receiving income into his bank checking account and cash remaining of processing, plus in savings.

The Department denied the Petitioner's MA application for excess assets (over \$2,000). However, Department policy states in ERM 205 that "the budgetable portion of income deposited into a checking or savings account." Is not immediately counted as an asset. ERM 205 goes on to state, "(D)o **not** count the same funds as both income and an asset in the same month."

Testimony at the hearing revealed that the Petitioner received funds that were directly deposited into his checking account on a monthly basis. According to Department policy, these funds would not become an asset but counted as income until the month following the deposit of same.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department **did not** act in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Petitioner's MA application.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Reregister and reprocess the Petitioner's supplement for any missed benefits.
