HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 5, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. ISSUE

Did the Department properly decrease Petitioner's FAP benefits to per month effective October 1, 2016?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner is an ongoing FAP recipient.
- 2. On Redetermination and recalculated her eligibility for FAP benefits.
- 3. On which notified Petitioner that her FAP benefits would decrease to \$ per month, effective .

4. On Pepartment's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Additionally, the Department is required to periodically redetermine or renew an individual's eligibility for active programs. The redetermination process includes thorough review of all eligibility factors. BAM 210 (July 2016), p. 1. In this case, Petitioner submitted a Redetermination on which indicated that nothing had changed relating to her housing expenses. The Department presented a budget which revealed that the Department had not budgeted any housing expenses for Petitioner.

The Department confirmed that on her original application, Petitioner stated that she was paying an electric expense. Under Department policy, a client paying an electric expense is entitled to a non-heat standard of \$. RFT 255 (October 2016), p. 1. Given that Petitioner indicated on her Redetermination that nothing had changed, the non-heat standard should have been included in the budget to determine eligibility for FAP benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it decreased Petitioner's FAP benefits to **\$ per month effective**.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS

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HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

- 1. Redetermine Petitioner's eligibility for FAP benefits effective
- 2. Issue supplements Petitioner was eligible to receive but did not effective ; and
- 3. Notify Petitioner of its decision in writing.
