### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 7, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner appeared on her own behalf. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Eligibility Specialist [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

### **ISSUE**

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On October 6, 2016, the Department issued a Notice of Case Action (Exhibit 1 Pages 9-13) informing Petitioner that she would receive \$ [REDACTED] per month in FAP beginning November 1, 2016.
2. On October 27, 2016, the Department issued a Notice of Case Action (Exhibit 1 Pages 4-7) informing Petitioner that she would receive \$ [REDACTED] per month in FAP beginning December 1, 2016.
3. The FAP award was premised upon Petitioner having earned income of \$ [REDACTED] and unearned income of \$ [REDACTED] for her household.

4. Petitioner works at an on-call job as a Certified Nurse's Aid, and she can go for months at a time without working. Her income is very sporadic and unpredictable.
5. On October 27, 2016, the Department received Petitioner's hearing request, protesting the FAP award.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Department acknowledged that Petitioner's earned income is based upon an erroneous finding that her income is regular and predictable. BEM (7/1/16) p. 10 instructs the Department regarding irregular income:

#### ***Irregular Income***

For irregular income, determine the standard monthly amount by adding the amounts entered together and dividing by the number of months used.

Bridges will convert or average income automatically, when appropriate, based on the information you enter about the income.

The Department did not consider the irregular nature of her income when they calculated her FAP award. When Petitioner works even a few hours in a day, she is paid for that day. Her pay "stub" does not reflect a year-to-date amount that can be used to calculate her income over a period of time. It will be necessary to obtain verification from the Employer to determine how much her income has been, and over what period of time.

**DECISION AND ORDER**


The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it considered Petitioner's income to be regular when preparing her FAP budget.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **MODIFIED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Obtain verification of Petitioner's actual earned income and redetermine her FAP award as of November 1, 2016.
2. Provide Petitioner with a supplement if she is found to be eligible.
