HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Terresented by Terres

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly close the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On due , the Department sent the Petitioner a Redetermination form due .
- 2. The Petitioner testified that he called the Department numerous times within a given period of time; and the Department provided detail of its phone logs from **Example 1**. These long showed no phone calls from the phone number given the Department by the Petitioner.
- 3. On Redetermination Filing Record warning the Petitioner that it had not received the required information necessary to continue his FAP benefits.
- 4. On failure to provide requested information/documentation.

5. On **Contract of the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the closure of his FAP benefits.**

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Petitioner testified at the hearing that he had in fact turned in the Redetermination form in a timely manner. The Petitioner also testified that he called numerous times and then attempted to get assistance from the Department.

The Department provided a log of the phone calls made to the Department on the dates specified by the Petitioner, and no numbers provided by the Petitioner were found in the phone log on the days that the Petitioner testified that he called the Department.

The Department's request for verifications is supported in Department policy BAM 130 (July 2016), demands that a client/Petitioner provide the requested documentation/verification.

The Petitioner was unable to provide any evidence that he had in fact provided the Department with the requested verifications.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed the Petitioner's FAP benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
