HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 13, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) failed to appear and the hearing was held in their absence.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly calculate Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner was a FAP recipient.
2. On December 9, 2015, Petitioner notified the Department of loss of income; Petitioner verified this loss on December 10, 2015.
3. Petitioner's FAP benefits were not increased until April 1, 2016.
4. On February 23, Petitioner requested a hearing, arguing that her benefits should have increased as of January 1, 2016.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Changes which result in an increase in the household's benefits must be effective no later than the first FAP allotment issued 10 days after the date the change was reported, provided any necessary verification was returned by the due date. BAM 220, pg. 7 (2015).

Petitioner notified the Department of the change on December 9, 2016, and verified the change on December 10. The first allotment 10 days after the date of the change was January 1, 2016. The Department did not contest Petitioner's testimony.

Therefore, the Department erred when it failed to change Petitioner's FAP benefits on January 1, 2016.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to change Petitioner's FAP benefits as of January 1, 2016.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Recalculate Petitioner's FAP benefits retroactive to January 1, 2016, using Petitioner's actual income for the months in question.
2. Issue any benefit supplements to which the Petitioner is otherwise entitled.
