HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Eligibility Specialist, and [REDACTED], Hearing Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly process the Petitioner's Semi-Annual Contact Report adding five (5) members of the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) group?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a Semi-Annual Contact Report with proofs due by [REDACTED].
2. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner returned the Semi-Annual Contact Report.
3. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a Notice of Case Action informing her that her FAP application had been approved on [REDACTED]; however, the Department made no allowance for the Petitioner's FAP benefits in the month of [REDACTED].

4. Subsequently, the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the Department's failure to begin the Petitioner's FAP benefits in the month of [REDACTED].

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Petitioner complied with requests of the Department for various proofs in a timely manner on [REDACTED].

Department policy BAM 220 demands that the Department complete the FAP eligibility determination in time to affect the month that occurs 10 days after the change is reported.

In the instant case, the Petitioner easily complies with the 10-day restriction in BAM 220; because the Respondent's benefits should have begun 10 days after the [REDACTED], compliance with the Department's requests for information.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department **did not** act in accordance with Department policy when it failed to begin the Petitioner's FAP benefits 10 days after the Petitioner complied with the Department's requests for information.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Begin the Petitioner's FAP benefits in accordance with BAM 220 and the [REDACTED], date that the Petitioner's requested proofs.
