HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 31, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED] Family Independence Manager.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's [REDACTED] application for SER benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], Petitioner applied for SER services to assist with relocation services.
2. On [REDACTED], the Department sent Petitioner a State Emergency Relief Decision Notice which notified Petitioner that her application for SER benefits had been denied for failure to provide an eviction notice.
3. On [REDACTED], Petitioner filed a Request for Hearing disputing the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The SER program is administered by the Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.7001-.7049.

Additionally, State Emergency Relief (SER) assists individuals and families to resolve or prevent homelessness by providing money for rent, security deposits, and moving expenses. ERM 303 (October 2015), p.1. In this case, Petitioner applied for SER services seeking assistance with relocation services. In her application for benefits, Petitioner indicated that she had been evicted. Under Department policy, persons at imminent risk of homelessness must provide a court summons, order or judgment resulting from an eviction action. ERM 303, p 3.

The Department testified that it did not receive an eviction notice. However, Petitioner testified that she provided the eviction notice. An eviction notice was signed by the court on [REDACTED], prior to the date of application. No one with first-hand knowledge of Petitioner's application submission was present at the hearing. Therefore, Petitioner's testimony that she timely submitted the eviction notice is accepted as true. While the Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's SER application for lack of an eviction notice, Petitioner testified that since she applied for SER benefits, she has moved into her current residence and is not facing eviction. Therefore, the emergency no longer exists.

DECISION AND ORDER

The undersigned has no authority to order the Department to reprocess Petitioner's [REDACTED] SER application when the emergency no longer exists.

The Department is not required to re-register and reprocess Petitioner's [REDACTED] SER application.
