HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 15, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department was represented by Assistance Payments Supervisor [REDACTED]. Testimony was received from all participants. Department's Exhibit A, pages 1-11 was admitted into evidence.

ISSUE

Did the Department determine the proper amount of Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is an ongoing recipient of \$ [REDACTED] per month of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
2. Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefit group includes herself and her adult son. They are homeless so there are no shelter expenses.
3. On July 25, 2016, Petitioner submitted a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.


During this hearing Petitioner's income and expenses were verified. Petitioner's FAP benefit group consists of herself and her adult son. Petitioner's son receives \$ [REDACTED] per month of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits and \$ [REDACTED] per month of state benefits. Petitioner receives \$ [REDACTED] per month of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits and \$ [REDACTED] per month of state benefits. Petitioner also receives \$ [REDACTED] per month from Friend of the Court in child support arrearage payments. Petitioner has no shelter expenses and no reported medical expenses. The Food Assistance Program (FAP) budget was reviewed and the Department properly computed the claimant's net income and expenses. The federal regulations at 7 CFR 273.10 provide standards for the amount of a household's benefits. The Department in compliance with the federal regulations has prepared income limit and issuance tables which are set forth at Program Reference Manual, Table 250 and Table 260. The tables provide that a household with household size and net income of the Petitioner's is eligible for a Food Assistance Program (FAP) allotment of \$ [REDACTED] per month.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
