HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 28, 2016, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED]. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Assistance Payment Worker. [REDACTED] appeared as an observer on behalf of the Department.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's application for FIP benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], Petitioner applied for FIP benefits.
2. On [REDACTED], the Department sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action which informed Petitioner that her application for FIP benefits had been denied.
3. On [REDACTED], Petitioner filed a Request for Hearing disputing the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FIP pursuant to 45 CFR 233-260, MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101-.3131.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

FAP

The hearing was requested to dispute the Department's action taken with respect to the FAP and FIP program benefits. Shortly after commencement of the hearing, Petitioner testified that she now understood the actions taken by the Department relating to her FAP benefits and did not wish to proceed with the hearing for that issue only. The Request for Hearing relating to FAP benefits was withdrawn. The Department agreed to the partial dismissal of the hearing request. Pursuant to the partial withdrawal of the hearing request filed in this matter, the Request for Hearing for FAP benefits is dismissed.

FIP

In this case, Petitioner applied for FIP benefits on [REDACTED]. The Department confirmed that at the time of application, Petitioner indicated that she was pregnant. Petitioner gave birth to her child on [REDACTED]. In the [REDACTED] Notice of Case Action, one of the reasons cited for the denial was that was that Petitioner was not pregnant. This was clearly incorrect. The Department agreed that Petitioner's application for FIP benefits had been denied in error.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's application for FIP benefits.


Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Re-register and reprocess Petitioner's [REDACTED] application for FIP benefits;
2. Issue any supplements Petitioner was eligible to receive but did not; and
3. Notify Petitioner in writing of its decision.

Petitioner's Request for Hearing relating to FAP benefits only is **DISMISSED** pursuant to a Request for Withdrawal on the record.
